Pack Lunch & Picnic In The Park

Historic Springfield has two parks that are open for picnic lunches. These parks are safe. There are no picnic tables so children will need to sit in the grass.

Distance from Sweet Pete's: 1.28 miles

First named Dignan Park, for a chairman of the Board of Public Works, it opened in 1907 and contained the City's first supervised playground. The United Confederate Veterans chose Jacksonville as the site for their annual reunion in 1914, and the park as the site for a monument honoring the Women of the Southland.

Distance from Sweet Pete's: 1.47 miles

The park and adjacent Boulevard were created along Hogans Creek between 1899 and 1901, on land donated by a developer, the Springfield Company. The City's first zoo opened at the park in 1914, followed by the first municipal swimming pool in 1922.

TEMPER & MOLD CHOCOLATE LEARN & PARTICIPATE (Available All Year)

CANDY CANE PULL LEARN & PARTICIPATE (Available 11/1-12/31)

Candy canes are a time honored tradition. Once upon a time all candy canes were hand pulled, today it is a lost art form and almost all canes are mass produced. Children will watch a video on the mass production of candy canes. As a class they will choose the flavor and color of the candy canes the class will make. They will watch the hand pulling process from beginning to end and will each roll and shape at least one cane. Older children will learn about the various chemical reactions that take place in the process. Children will leave with the candy canes they rolled.
